CONVENTIONS USED IN THIS BOOK

This songbook is primarily geared towards the intermediate Deadhead picker who knows these songs fairly well and just needs the chords and lyrics to keep them honest.

To ensure all songs fit on a single page, this songbook maximizes real estate by only notating unique sections. Typically, this includes the intro, first verse, and chorus, unless subsequent sections vary. Additionally, if a verse has four lines of a repeating chord progression, only the first line is notated.

All songs are in 4/4, unless time signature is provided top right of page.

Song titles have the key of the song in parenthesis, like After Midnight (E).

Less common chords are notated like this $F^{maj7=xx3210}$ (low E string is left most digit)

G D C G

Chords are provided above the word where chord is first struck

Italic font, when it appears in a line of lyrics, indicates the singer is accompanied by other voices. For example, you will see italics in When I Paint My Masterpiece when Jerry sings segments of the verse with Bob. It can also represent backup singers' parts that are "secondary." Italics are also used for vocalizations like *whoa-oh*.

An <u>underlined</u> word shows when the chord changes for non-notated parts.

When you see arrow between chords, like $G \to Em$, it means to walk bass note down from G to Em as shorthand to notating as $G^{/F\#}$ $G^{/F}$ Em
